WHAT IT DOES


- Build a regulated market that allows licensed operators to access capital and engage in interstate commerce, weakening illicit markets
- Address banking, financial access, and the burden of 280E taxes on legal businesses
- Equip state law enforcement with the resources to enforce their cannabis laws effectively
- Support real-time research on the cannabis being used across the country

WHAT IT DOESN'T DO:


- It does NOT create new cannabis markets.
- Instead, it aligns federal policy with state decisions, ensuring safer existing markets and allowing federal resources to focus on keeping cannabis out of states where it remains illegal.

PUBLIC PULSE:



THE STATES 2.0 ACT:



Allows states to make their own choice by amending the Controlled Substances Act so that its provisions no longer apply to any person acting in compliance with state or tribal laws relating to cannabis use.



Helps small businesses by creating a rational marketplace where licensed operators can access capital and interstate commerce necessary to beat out illicit markets.



Gives federal government oversight to ensure products are safe, consistent, and out of the hands of America's youth.



Protects public safety by providing law enforcement with the tools needed to appropriately enforce their state's desired laws, whether cannabis remains legal or illegal.




Prevents youth access by prohibiting individuals under the age of 21 from consuming or distributing cannabis products, unless for medical purposes.
